Today's feast, The Baptism of the Lord, reminds us of our own Baptism and special calling. Baptism is more than a ritual moment on a specific day; it is a gift of divine life and a calling to become followers of Jesus Christ.

As followers of Jesus Christ what we are about is building the Kingdom of God in the local area. This is not the work of just a few people, but the work of all the baptized. Thank you for all sharing in the building God's kingdom here at Our Lady of the Lake.

New Building New Year

We are less than 6 months to groundbreaking of our new building. Over the last year we have listened to our parishioners, city council, and neighbors and have modified the building plan accordingly. We now have a firm plan with a \$16 million budget and are on track to start construction in June of 2010. In the last 3 months we have received design approval from the City of Lake Oswego and the Archdioceses of Portland. We have firm commitments from over 250 parishioners, school parents and friends of the parish. We have received \$185,000 from Foundations and Trusts and \$140,000 from Company Matching Gifts. We continue to sit down face to face with donors and complete the 5 year pledge commitments.

This month we will be holding a series of "house parties," informational gatherings in various parishioners' homes. If you have not already completed your pledge card this a perfect time to get together, ask questions, and become a part of the community helping to build our new parish center and school.

Sacramental Preparation

This morning I had the privilege of taking the OLL School 2nd graders to church for the enrollment rite. The first lesson in the books is about Baptism. To help the children remember their Baptism, I plan a little ritual, which consists of renewing the Baptismal promises and the reception of a small bottle of holy water. Children love ritual especially when they get something. The children were delightful. We sang a song, talked about God knowing each of us by name, and about being given a mission at Baptism. One of the children interjected, "And God knows the Chinese people's names too". Everyone was thoroughly impressed with God's spectacular memory! The children enrolled in the RE program will experience the same ritual this Sunday following the 9 AM Mass.

As our parish children begin their preparation for First Holy Communion may we renew our faith in the Eucharist, especially as we are sent out each week to "go in peace to love and serve the world". Let us also pray for the children and their families as they prepare to approach the Lord's Table. The children's simple belief, their sincerity, and their questions will enkindle commitment to live the Eucharist.

Baptism and Life:

"Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what 'life' really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await 'eternal life' - the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (*cf. Jn 10:10*), has also explained to us what 'life' means: 'this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent' (*Jn 17:3*). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we 'live'" - Pope Benedict XVI, *Encyclical on Hope*, November 30, 2007.

Music for Baptism of the Lord

As our baptism calls us to spread the Gospel we sing “Go, Tell It on the Mountain.”

Our Entrance and Recessional Hymn is “When Jesus Comes to Be Baptized”. The text is from 1974, Stanbrook Abbey. The tune is Winchester New, a tune that we know as “On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's cry”, from an Advent text about John the Baptist. This new text, though, directs our attention to Jesus and the Holy Spirit of the Lord, who “Anoints the Christ to suffering, to preach the word, to free the bound and to the mourner comfort bring.” In verse four we petition that same Spirit to “help us be like Christ: To live in love and charity, to walk in truth and justice now, and grow in Christian dignity.”

“Christ, the Sun of Light” highlights Christ, his baptism - and ours - and brings together this day with Christmas. The tune is the German Christmas Carol, *In Dulci Jubilo*, that we know as “Good Christians Friends, Rejoice.” - Tom Carawan

“Catholics Returning Home” Discuss *Falling Away and Returning* January 12

All communities depend on full and active citizen participation for growth and development. The Catholic Church community sees this involvement as a precious gift to the Catholic faith community. When Catholics are inactive or alienated from the Church, the Parish family is incomplete. The Returning Catholics ministry at Our Lady of the Lake embraces all Catholics considering returning to the Church.

Were you raised Catholic but do not come or seldom come to church anymore? This Tuesday, “Catholics Returning Home” explores the reasons behind why Catholics leave the Church and why estranged Catholics return. Readings and discussion of the parables in Luke 15, 1-32 is also planned. The group meets in the Parish library at 7 PM. See how lovingly Our Father welcomes us back-and how He waits for us to return to Him.

The Seven Last Words of Christ-Lenten Small Faith Sharing Groups

The A GiFT Ministry is pleased to announce the 2010 Lenten Program, *The Seven Last Words of Christ: A Bible Study on the Passion of Jesus*. This series is part of the Emmaus Journey Bible Study series found on *The Word Among Us* website.

Each session in the 7-week program lasts 90 minutes and consists of three parts: introductory reflection, learning from Scripture, and experiencing, and praying and living Jesus' words. No prior study or bible knowledge is necessary. Every week, you will study a short sentence uttered by Jesus as he endured his crucifixion.
