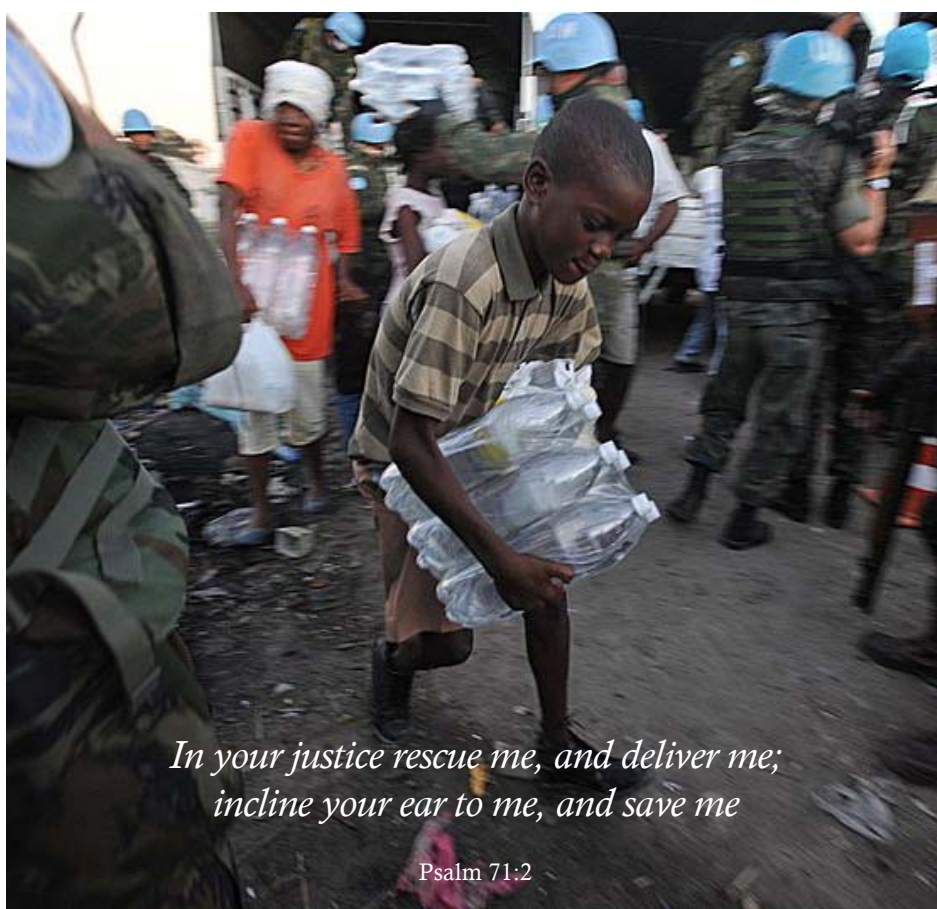

“It Is An Honor To Be Their Teacher. . .”

I have taught Religious Education at OLL for three years. It is truly a joy to assist parents in teaching their children about our Catholic faith. I am hoping that if I share how I manage my RE curriculum and classroom, more parishioners will realize that they not only have the heart - but also the time and talent - for serving our children.

At the start of the RE season, I spend about four hours deciding the major themes and Bible stories I want to include for the entire year, and then look over the provided curriculum. I have a family member who creates and prepares all of the craft projects to coincide with the themes for each Sunday.

On the Sunday's we have RE class (RE season is just over half the year) I arrive approximately 30 minutes early to set up materials and talk with my co-teacher and/or parent volunteer. With the larger classes, it is extremely helpful to have a consistent presence helping with set-up/clean-up, clerical tasks, and relationship building with the children. My lesson plans each Sunday follow the same general outline including opening play, memory verse, lesson with story, craft, and alter/prayer time. My “secret” to making RE manageable for me, personally, is having a team of other adults to work with, who fill in with their gifts where mine are not as strong.

If God has given you a gift for teaching others, will you help guide and influence the precious children in our parish? You do not need to have children in the RE program to volunteer; in fact, teaching on Sunday's could be considered another ministry in that you are giving parents of young children one hour at Mass to spiritually refresh their own faith and commitment to their children. If the Spirit is not leading you to teaching, could you instead be the person that consistently creates and prepares the crafts for a classroom, or leads music for 10 minutes every Sunday? Could you be a full time co-teacher, for just over 20 one-hour long classes? It sounds cliché to say that being a part of the RE program is "the gift that keeps on giving" but it really is - both for the adults and children involved. Thank you to all of the wonderful families who have shared their children with me over the past three years; they are all special gifts from God and it is an honor to be able to be their teacher.

Music at Mass

In this week's second reading from Corinthians, Paul speaks of the greatest of all the gifts: love. At the Preparation of the Altar and the Presentation of the Gifts we sing *God Is Love* to the tune "Abbot's Leigh". During Communion we sing *Love One Another* by James J. Chepponis with text based on I John 4: "Love one another, for love is of God. Love one another, for God is love."

Choir — rehearses weekly on Wednesdays at 7:00 PM in the Church. We sing at the 11:00 AM Mass on Sundays.

Choir Easter Camp is Saturday, February 6 in the Parish Hall. We prepare for Lent, Triduum, and Easter at this mini-retreat. We begin with Mass at 8:15 AM, followed by hospitality. Guest clinician Judith Montgomery, of the University of Portland, will spend the morning working with us on Vocal Skills and the season's music. After lunch, more rehearsal! led by Tom Morse. We conclude at 3 PM.

Musicians for Life — These Youth and Young Adult Musicians practice each Sunday at 4:00 PM in the Church and lead the music for the Life Teen Mass at 6:00 PM.

Ministry to the Homebound and Care Facilities

Some of you may wonder what this ministry is about. This ministry is to bring the Eucharist to those who cannot come to Mass because of aging, illness or disability. For most of us this ministry is invisible, but we have a small group of volunteers who sacrifice their time and energy to serve our elderly in their homes, retirement homes, or adult care homes. We are grateful for their service. However, we are very thin right now.

We need more volunteers for this ministry! Some of ministers have already reached the age of 75. We need new people to sub for them when they need vacations or when they retire in the future. And we need new people to back up in this ministry so everyone has a chance to take a break.

This is one of most important ministries in our parish. In doing this ministry, we practice what Jesus taught: "When I am ill, have you visited me?" The Lord does not abandon us, so we should not abandon our brothers and sisters who need our visits. This ministry does not consume a lot of your time. One hour per week is enough if you have an assignment. You can visit people on weekends. It does not require many skills, except your heart.

If anyone has done this ministry before, we will be happy to have you. If you want to do this ministry, but you do not have any experience we can train you and give you time to adapt. All you need to have are time and love for our people.
