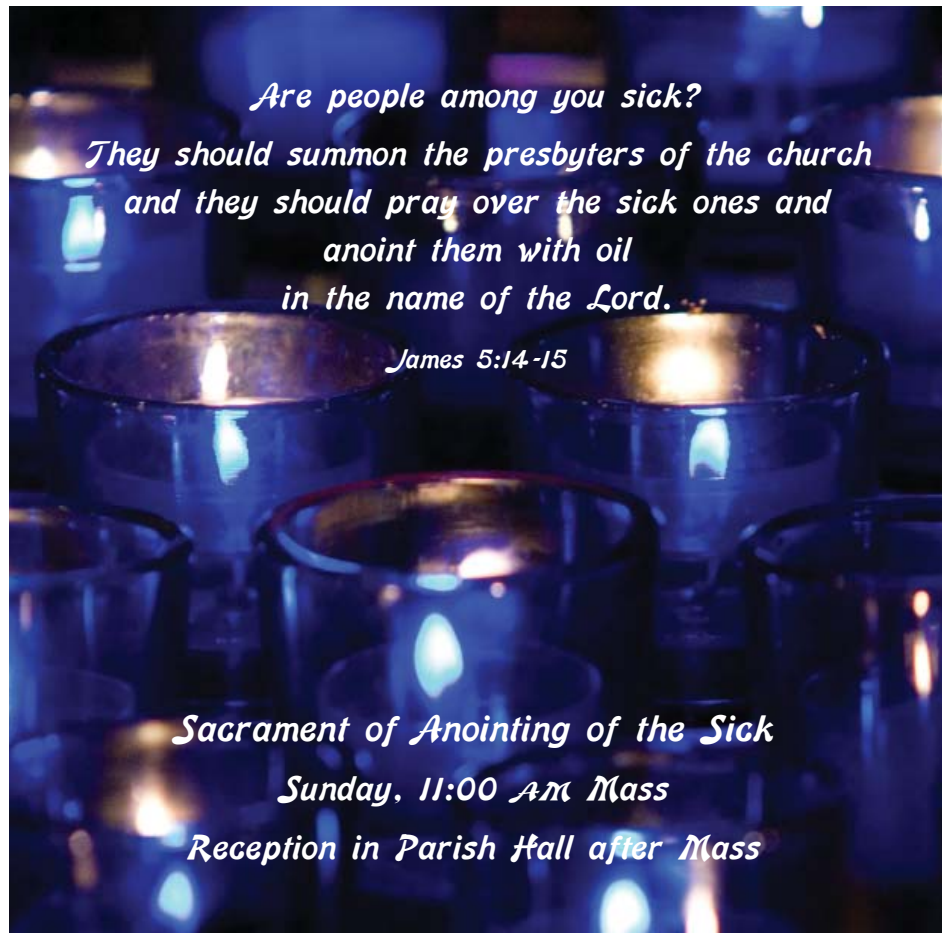

Stay Alert!!

Thank you for your patience. Construction will keep us short of good parking in the next several weeks. We will have signs to guide you to available parking. Parishioners with special needs may park in the front church drive if necessary.



This week (8/30-9/4)

- Handicapped parking behind the church will be available this weekend. Also look for "Temporary Accessible Parking" signs along 8th Street and A Avenue. This parking is for handicapped and special needs parishioners.
- The 8th Street entrance to parking will be closed for a few more weeks. Please enter the parking area from A Avenue or Evergreen via the alley.
- Curb and sidewalk work is nearly complete around the church on A Avenue and 8th Street, and parking is available on the street.



Coming up:

- The 8th Street entrance to the parking lot will still be closed. Contractors hope to complete work on the drive by mid-September. Follow signs for access via the alley from A Avenue or 8th Street. Parking behind the church may be inaccessible at times during the next few weeks as contractors complete drainage and fill work in that area. Signs will indicate alternative parking. Handicapped parking will be available on 8th Steet and A Avenue.

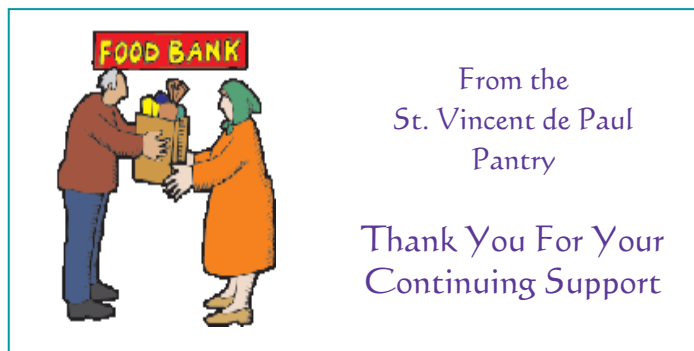

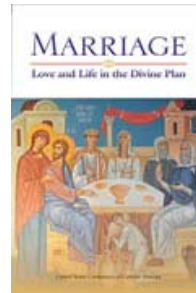

Learning Readiness

Research tells us that routines are important and can assist students in becoming better learners. Routines can also positively affect the “big three” study skills of attitude, organization and self-discipline. As your family is preparing for school, consider adopting the routines identified below to help your child feel more . . .

- ✓ Relaxed ~ Music can help your child avoid the morning rush. Play a soothing tape and ask them to be dressed and ready by the time it’s over. An added help is to have them lay out their clean uniform the night before.
- ✓ Energized ~ A good breakfast increases concentration. Packing a healthy snack and lunch will also help them keep their energy level up for their day of study.
- ✓ Connected ~ Talking about the school day lets your child know you are. Ask each child to share two good things that happened during the day. Prompt them with specific questions, e.g. “Which multiplication tables did you work on today in school?”
- ✓ Prepared ~ Studying a little bit every day is the best way to learn new materials. A short review each day of the new material will help move it from short term to long term memory. Help your youngster choose a time for homework when they are the most alert ~ and try not to change it.
- ✓ Rested ~ A set bedtime helps children fall asleep more quickly. Suggest that your child get in bed 15 minutes early to read, make up stories or talk quietly with you.

Called to Protect Workshops

To all new parents of, and any adult, working with, children under the age of 18: The Archdiocese of Portland has mandated that adults working with minors must participate in the safe environment program entitled, “**Called to Protect**”.

This program is required of all adults who volunteer at Our Lady of the Lake Parish in the school, religious education programs, Edge, Life Teen, or CYO. If you wish to volunteer in one of these programs you must participate in this training prior to your work with children. You can meet this initial requirement attending one of the workshops listed below. The training includes watching the videos and taking part in the discussions following the videos. If you attended a “Called to Protect” training previously, you do not need to attend these sessions again. However you must take the on-line updates through ARMATUS*. This is not an optional process.

Anyone without documentation of this training may not volunteer in any parish program that involves children.

Judging the Qualities of Music for the Liturgy

126. In judging the appropriateness of music for the Liturgy, one will examine its liturgical, pastoral, and musical qualities. Ultimately, however, these three judgments are but aspects of one evaluation, which answers the question: "Is this particular piece of music appropriate for this use in this particular Liturgy?" All three judgments must be considered together, and no individual judgment can be applied in isolation from the other two. This evaluation requires cooperation, consultation, collaboration, and mutual respect among those who are skilled in any of the three judgments, be they pastors, musicians, liturgists, or planners.

The Liturgical Judgment

127. The question asked by this judgment may be stated as follows: Is this composition capable of meeting the structural and textual requirements set forth by the liturgical books for this particular rite?

128. Structural considerations depend on the demands of the rite itself to guide the choice of parts to be sung, taking into account the principle of progressive solemnity. A certain balance among the various elements of the Liturgy should be sought, so that less important elements do not overshadow more important ones. Textual elements include the ability of a musical setting to support the liturgical text and to convey meaning faithful to the teaching of the Church.

The USCCB Committee on Divine Worship, and its president Cardinal Francis George, has set implementation of the new edition for Advent, 2011. This version is a new translation of the 500 year old Latin Mass and not a change to the Mass itself.
